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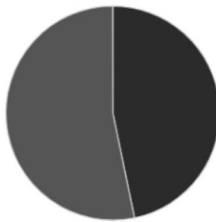

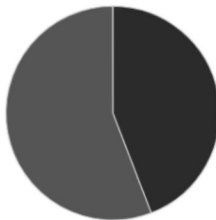

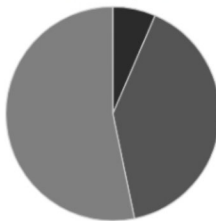

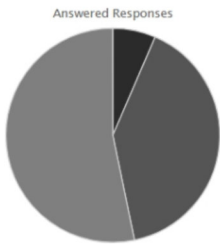

Generally speaking, would you prefer to go to one or the other of our central region parishes for **evening** First Fridays



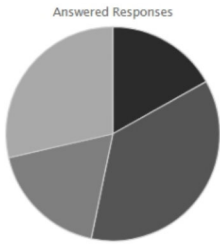

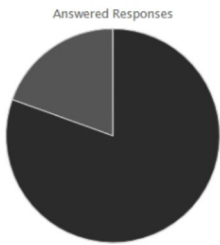

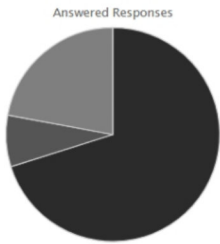

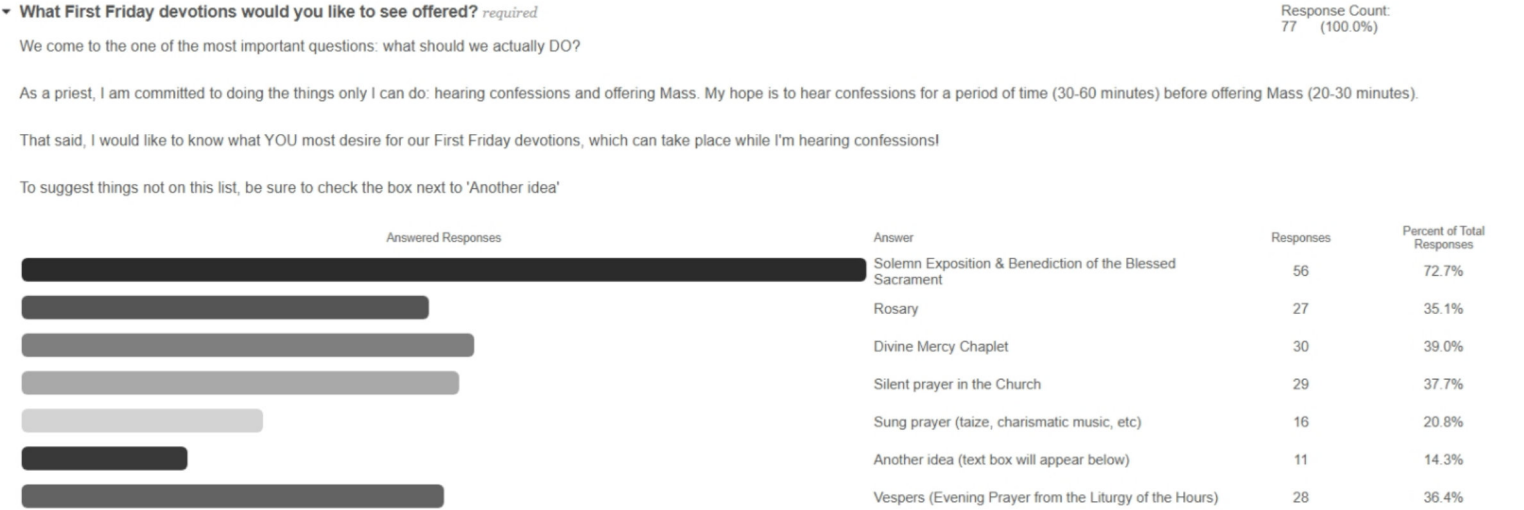
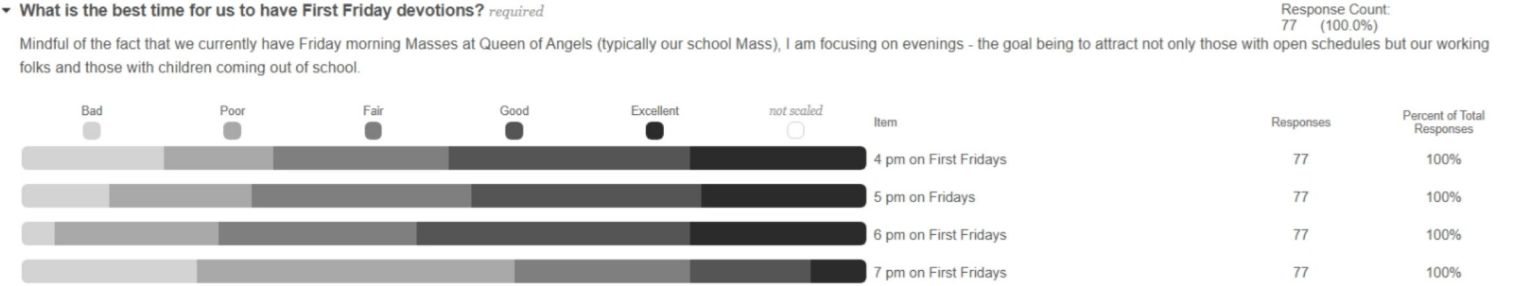
▼ If we had First Friday devotions at both locations, how would you choose which one to go to? *required*
